IN RE: DUI, DRIVER IMPROVEMENT AND
CHILD RESTRAINT SAFETY PROGRAMS

The Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles is responsible for the certification of DUI and Driver Improvement Programs. The Chief Judge has the authority to authorize DUI, driver improvement programs, **and child restraint safety programs** to operate within his/her jurisdiction. All DUI and Driver Improvement programs must provide like-program elements to ensure the citizens of Palm Beach County participate in programs which are equitable with one another.

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the authority conferred by Florida Rule of Judicial Administration 2.215, it is **ORDERED** as follows:


A. DUI AND DRIVER IMPROVEMENT PROGRAMS

1. DUI and Driver Improvement Programs being established in Palm Beach County must provide the following services and that Certification within the Fifteenth Circuit shall be given only to programs meeting these prerequisites.
2. All DUI and Driver Improvement programs must provide services in or near the Belle Glade area on an as needed basis for client enrollment, evaluation and/or consultation. All schedules are subject to review by Chief Judge.
3. All DUI and Driver Improvement programs **MUST** provide bilingual services to ensure clients have full access to programs service(s).
4. All DUI and Driver Improvement programs must comply with Americans with Disabilities Act, 1990 for those clients requiring a reasonable accommodation.
5. Driver Improvement programs must electronically report students' course completions to the Clerk of Court within ten (10) days of said completion.

B. CHILD RESTRAINT SAFETY PROGRAM

The "Child Saver Program" operated by the Safety Council of Palm Beach County Inc. is approved as a child restraint safety program as required by Florida Statute 316.613(5) (2009).
