## PER CURIAM.

The Petition for Writ of Certiorari is GRANTED based on the improper administration of telephonic oaths. *See Cordaro v. Dep't of Highway Safety & Motor Vehicles*, Case No. 19CA15583, 29 Fla. L. Weekly Supp. 80a (Fla. 15th Cir. Ct. Apr. 21, 2021). Accordingly, the hearing officer's order rendered on February 16, 2023, is QUASHED and the matter is REMANDED for a new formal hearing. *See Gordon v. State, Dep't of Highway Safety & Motor Vehicles*, 166 So. 3d 902, 904–05 (Fla. 4th DCA 2015).
