PER CURIAM.

The trial court's order denying Appellant's motion to amend the complaint is **AFFIRMED** as to all issues except the award of trial-level attorney's fees. The trial court's

award of attorney fees to Appellee is not ripe for review at this time, as the amount of attorney fees awarded to Appellee has not yet been set by the trial court. *Knight v. Mastrianni*, 626 So. 2d 338 (Fla. DCA 4th 1993). Upon issuance of the mandate, the trial court may set the amount of trial-level attorney's fees.

Under section 83.48, Florida Statutes (2015), the Court may award appellate attorney fees in favor of the prevailing party. Accordingly, Appellee's Motion for Appellate Attorney Fees is **GRANTED**. The matter is remanded to the trial court to determine a reasonable amount of appellate attorney's fees.
